VPCF COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Virginia Police Chiefs Foundation College Scholarship Program is a needs-based scholarship for dependent children of active police officers in the Commonwealth of Virginia. The scholarship is not available to dependent children of sheriff's deputies, federal officers, or civilian personnel working in police agencies. **All scholarship applications must be postmarked by April 3, 2009.**

FIRST LINE SUPERVISORS TRAINING SCHOOL

April 7-9, 2009

Natural Bridge Hotel; Natural Bridge, VA

This program is designed to assist officers in their transition to their new role as supervisor and is most applicable to individuals who have had little or no prior supervisory training. Basic supervisory concepts will be presented that will serve as a foundation to enable each supervisor to identify some of the most critical components of supervision. Legal credit is included in this training. **The application deadline for this training is March 20, 2009.**

EXECUTIVE MANAGEMENT IN-SERVICE TRAINING

April 29, May 6 & May 13, 2009

Roanoke, Weyers Cave, and Williamsburg, VA

This year, the In-service Training will be three separate one-day programs held in Roanoke, Weyers Cave and Williamsburg. Class sessions will run from 9 am to 4 pm each day and lunch will be included. The agenda includes Family Medical Leave Act, Personnel Issues, Cultural Diversity, Interoperability & Homeland Security, Legislative Update, Internal Affairs-Best Practices and Military Reinstatement. Also included on the agenda is a Chiefs Town Hall Meeting focusing on Immigration Issues and Off-duty Officer Involved Shooting. This training is designed for chiefs, deputy chiefs and command staff and will be approved for DCJS in-service credit, including legal and cultural diversity credit, if attending those sessions. **The registration deadline for all three sessions is April 17, 2009.**

2009 PELSAA LEADERSHIP TRAINING: HOLOCAUST MUSEUM AND MARINE CORPS MUSEUM

May 18-19, 2009

Washington, DC, and Quantico, VA

The 2009 PELSAA Leadership Training is open to all chief executives, managers, supervisors and law enforcement officers. You do not need to be a PELS or ILCT graduate to attend. The program includes a guided tour and lecture at the US Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, DC, entitled "Leadership and Tolerance" and a guided tour and lecture at the US Marine Corps Museum in Quantico, Virginia, entitled "When Faced with Adversity, You Overcome". Cultural diversity credit is included in this training. **The application deadline for this training is April 20, 2009.**

INSTITUTE FOR LEADERSHIP IN CHANGING TIMES (ILCT)

Session 1: June 14-19 & September 22-24, 2009

Virginia Tech; Blacksburg, VA

Session 2: July 12-17 & September 29-October 1, 2009

Designed for individuals occupying a first-line or mid-management level position in a public or private sector business or law-enforcement agency, the ILCT is an education-based leadership program designed to develop creative thinking and leadership skills. The curriculum draws upon a variety of subjects related to leadership in successful organizations today. **The application deadline for both sessions is May 1, 2009.**

PROFESSIONAL EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP SCHOOL (PELS)

25th Session: September 14-18; October 12-16; & November 9-12, 2009

University of Richmond; Richmond, VA

The Professional Executive Leadership School (PELS) is an intensive three-week, liberal arts-based educational experience that focuses on the study of leadership and is geared for chief executive officers and managers, and candidates from the private sector, public safety, and government agencies are invited to apply. Legal and cultural diversity credit is included in this training. An open enrollment process is utilized for this program.

SENIOR EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP FORUM (SELF)

June 21-26 & October 7-9, 2009

Virginia Commonwealth University, Richmond, VA

The Senior Executive Leadership Forum is the final step in our leadership education series. SELF is designed for those in senior level and executive staff positions who are responsible for policy-making, financial management and critical decision-making at the executive level of the organization. SELF will offer a dynamic, business based simulation that permits participants to practice business and leadership decisions in a team-centric experience.
